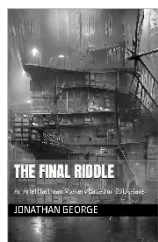

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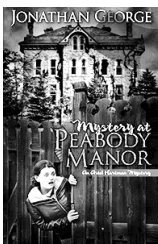
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How to Use This Guide

The Word2U study system blends the essential aspects that make an effective study program in Senior Bible Quizzing with the elements of a devotional. You won't just be memorizing. You'll be digging deeper into the meaning of the verses you're learning, praying the Word, and learning how to apply Scripture to your own walk with God.

This section provides an overview of this resource, including the contents of the document and how to use the guide as part of your study.

INTRODUCTIONS

Introductions set the stage for what you are about to study. The general introduction at the beginning of the guide provides a brief overview of the material and the theme for the year. Each section or chapter opening summarizes the primary context of the chapter or section and the key takeaways from the verses you are about to learn.

Introduction



The dictionary defines *doctrine* as a set of beliefs or principles taught by a religious organization. Because belief systems vary, this could mean different things to different people.

What is important for us to understand and practice are what the apostles believed and taught. At the beginning of the church, believers continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine (Acts 2:42). We are expected to do the same today.

Yet, before we can dive deep into the details of doctrine, it's necessary to take a step back. Biblical doctrine is much more than a list of dos and don'ts. The foundation of our faith is built on the gospel message. Jesus died on the cross, was buried in a tomb, and rose again on the third day. We follow our Savior into death at salvation and rise to walk in a new way of life through Spirit-led faith, attitude, and a holy lifestyle.

When you strip back the layers of salvation, holiness, and Christian disciplines, you find that at the heart of doctrine is a love story.

Yes, a love story! Our beliefs are rooted in an epic romance of a Bridegroom who is preparing Himself a glorious church, the Bride of Christ, without spot or wrinkle. It is a tale of a Bride-in-waiting longing for her wedding day in Glory.

The symbol above, also found in the header of the sections within this study guide, is an emblem in black and white of thorns and a cup. Each plays a part in the divine romance of redemption. In ancient Jewish betrothal ceremonies, the bride drinks from a cup as a sign of accepting a man's marriage proposal. This motif resurfaces on the eve of Christ's crucifixion.

The thorns, which Jesus wore as a crown, not only symbolizes Adam's curse to toil among thorns and thistles due to his disobedience, but it also portrays the bride-price for our salvation.

The contrast between light and dark colors suggests the Light of the world both pushed back the darkness of sin while also tasting death to bring us eternal life.

From this vine of thorns weaves a branch of believers which sprung from the cross and lives on today.

John, the apostle of love, said that God is love. His love beckons us to come up higher. He has saved the best for His Bride. His sacred love letters point the way.

In June 1941, the world was engulfed in war. Hitler had just invaded the Soviet Union, and the United States was within six months of being thrust into the melee after Japan attacked Pearl Harbor. In Des Moines, Iowa, however, love was in the air.

Joe and Nina Leaming had just wed. A little over a year later, the couple had a daughter, and 20-year-old Joe enlisted in the Navy. Every day, for the next two years, Joe wrote to his 19-year-old wife at home. Six hundred letters in all. Then, the letters stopped. At first, Nina didn't think much about it. It was common for the mail to get backed up, and then she'd receive a batch of six or seven letters at one time. But, on July 21, 1944, instead of a letter, Nina received a telegram. It began, "We regret to inform you..." The message went on to tell her that her young husband had drowned.

After that, Nina's world changed, but her fondness for Joe never did. Even after seven decades, Nina, despite her poor eyesight, turned to Joe's love letters from time to time for solace and to savor the memories they shared.

If letters written by a husband who had passed many years before could still move Nina, how much more should God's love letters, packaged into sixty-six books that we call the Bible, inspire us?

Despite the naysayers who question the Bible's validity, God's people know the power of the written word. Through a handful of God-anointed men, He gave us a record of His promises, wisdom, instructions, and love for humankind. It is more than a sacred book. It is a testament of Jesus, our heart's song.

The classification of God into separate persons represents an attempt at explaining God from a human perspective. One trinitarian scholar explained it this way:

What we mean by the Divine Trinity is that there are three separate and distinct persons in the Godhead, each one having His own personal spirit, body, personal soul in the same sense each human being, angel or other being has his own body, soul, and spirit.

Referring to God in the confines of distinct “persons” limits the indivisible nature of God. Most would agree that a father is one who contributes to the conception of a baby. However, Mathew 1:20 gives this station to the Holy Ghost. If the Holy Ghost is a separate person in the Godhead, then, according to this verse, the Holy Ghost is Jesus’ Father, not God the Father.

As Oneness believers, we take no issue with the Holy Ghost being responsible for the conception. David Bernard writes in his book, *Oneness of God*, the Holy Ghost in the context of Matthew 1:20 alludes to the working of God among man (Bernard, 2000). What was God’s work? His incarnation through Jesus.

Prayer

Do you need God to be at work in your life? Make your requests known to Him in faith.

Dr. Billy Graham received a letter from a woman who complained that the Bible was difficult to read. She asked if it was necessary to read it. Dr. Graham responded, "I see from your letter that you are a married woman. Did you ever receive a letter from your husband-to-be and decide you wouldn't bother reading it because his handwriting was poor, you were too busy, or for some other reason? Well, the Bible is God's 'love letter' to us."

The Bible is certainly a love letter from God. Throughout its pages, we read of God's faithfulness to His people. We also read about how we relate to Him. This is in much the same vein as marriage. When a man and woman wed, it's meant to be for life. The Bible is our instruction manual for living. We can trust the promises of God, and we can learn about the will and character of God from it.

Words spoken are too easily forgotten, but God's promises and plans for the ones He loves were important enough to be written in stone, and on the tablets of our hearts.

In Judaism, men and women place little leather boxes, called *tefillin*, on their foreheads and arms. These boxes contain small scrolls printed with certain passages, reminding the Israelites of God's delivering power and the rewards He gives to those who obey Him. One box is placed between the eyes on the forehead. This suggests that one's thoughts are to be steadfast and righteous. The other box is strapped to their arm next to their heart, illustrating that they are to serve God with their whole heart.

Is it any wonder that Jesus commanded us to love God with our whole heart? We prioritize the things we love. And, what about the verse that says we are to bring every thought into the obedience of Christ? The decision to obey God always starts as a conscious choice in our minds.

Like the *tefillin*, sometimes we need reminders that serving God is always done from a place of love.

Ask God to help you fall more in love with His Word as you study the verses.

The earliest recorded evidence of writing is a limestone tablet known as the Kish tablet, dating back to around 3,500 BC. This artifact shows an early form of writing known as cuneiform. Our writing is based on a series of letters we call the alphabet which we use to form words. In fact, the word *alphabet* comes from the first two letters in the Hebrew alphabet, *aleph* and *bet*.

Initially, information was passed by word of mouth. Once writing was invented, a lasting record could be made that would extend beyond generations of storytelling. Moses, along with other authors of the Bible, were commanded by God to put His thoughts on stone and parchment. Centuries later, we can refer to this written record of God's history and sacred laws that have become our textbook for life.

Prayer

Thank the Lord for having preserved His word that guides you on your life's path.

Within the legal system, eyewitness accounts have long played an important role in proving a defendant's guilt or innocence. Juries rely on eyewitness testimonies to lend weight to their verdicts.

Luke opened his gospel and the book of Acts by informing the reader that his account relied on eyewitness testimonies surrounding the lives of Jesus and the apostles. Because of this, his writings were given a place among the holy canon of scripture with the likes of Peter, Paul, and John.

But observations of the power of God was not just for close associates of Jesus and the apostles. Paul said we are epistles known and read of all men. Our actions and our words should give a personal testimony of God's goodness and grace.

To some around you, you are the only Bible they will ever read. What messages are they getting when they "read" you?

Optional Review Exercises

The following exercises can be incorporated into the review, as appropriate, to help improve recall and to add variety to the study program.

- ▶ **Reverse Card Referencing**: Display the “verse side” of the verse card and have the quizzers provide the verse reference.
- ▶ **Time Quoting**: Test a quizzers’ speed in quoting a chapter (or chapters) or a set of specific verses in the order they were memorized. Record the time and try to beat it each day over the next couple of days.
- ▶ **Unique Beginnings**: Using an alphabetical listing of verses, identify and quote scriptures with similar or identical beginnings. This is a great exercise for improving quotation completion and location questions.
- ▶ **Key Words and Phrases**: Look for similar or identical words or phrases. Some quizzers develop flash cards of these to use in conjunction with their verse cards when studying. This helps with cross-reference questions.
- ▶ **Difficult Verses**: Some quizzers need more time to get down certain verses. Set aside extra time to improve on trouble verses.
